## FIRST PEOPLES, SECOND CLASS TREATMENT

Stories about Indigenous health in Canada in mainstream society perpetuate racist stereotypes and inaccuracies. Narratives are frequently simplified and presented without context. For example, epidemiological data is often gathered and shared without consideration of historical and present-day impacts of colonial policies on the social determinants of health (i.e. access to education, housing, food insecurity, employment).

This document was created to highlight the voices and perspectives of Indigenous people themselves and *provides the necessary context* to understand stories about Indigenous health.

## **LESSONS FOR CARE PROVIDERS:**

- 1. Take health concerns seriously.
- 2. Hold self and colleagues to high care standards.
- 3. Understand NHIB and funding limitations.
- 4. Provide and advocate for culturally safe care.



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
