JORDAN'S PRINCIPLE

Jordan River Anderson was a First Nations child from Norway House Cree Nation in Manitoba born with complex medical needs requiring at-home care.

The provincial and federal governments could not agree on **who should pay** for his at-home care, thus Jordan remained in hospital and passed away there at the age of 5.

His death ignited a movement to uphold human rights for all First Nations children through the creation of the child-first principle called 'Jordan's Principle' in 2007, to ensure *access to necessary health services* and supports.

LESSONS FOR CARE PROVIDERS:

- 1. Facilitate immediate care for First Nations children.
- 2. Learn about Jordan's Principle and its procedures.
- 3. Ensure proper documentation and reporting to assist with applications.
